

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE
CHAPTER 16, ARTICLE NO. 14 OF
THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF 1979 OF
THE CITY OF MAYVILLE BY ADDING THERETO
ORDINANCES 16-1415, 16-1416, 16-1417

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND MAYOR OF THE CITY OF MAYVILLE,
NORTH DAKOTA

Section 1. Amendment.

Ordinances number 16-1415, 16-1416, and 16-1417 are hereby
added to the Revised Ordinances of 1979 of the City of Mayville to
read as follows:

16-1415 PARKING - OVER 48 HOURS

It shall be unlawful for anyone to park or leave
standing on any public street or highway in the City
any vehicle for a period longer than 48 hours con-
secutively provided this section shall not include
any area where shorter time is provided for parking,
nor shall this section be construed to permit parking
for a longer time than is provided in such areas.

16-1416 PARKING - SNOW REMOVAL

It shall be unlawful for anyone to park or leave
standing on any public street or highway in the City
any vehicle for a period longer than 24 hours
consecutively following a period of snow fall within
the City which would necessitate snow removal upon
the streets of the City.

16-1417 IMPOUNDING VEHICLES

A. Members of the police department are hereby
authorized to remove a vehicle from a street or
highway to the nearest garage or other place of
safety, or to a garage designated or maintained
by the police department, or otherwise maintained
by this city under the circumstances hereinafter
enumerated.

1. When any vehicle is left unattended upon any
bridge, viaduct, or causeway, or in any tube
or tunnel where such vehicle constitutes an
obstruction to traffic.
2. When a vehicle upon a street is so disabled
as to constitute an obstruction to traffice
and the person or persons in charge of the
vehicle are by reason of physical injury
incapacitated to such an extent as to be
unable to provide for its custody or removal.

3. When any vehicle is left unattended upon a street and is so parked illegally as to constitute a definite hazard or obstruction to the normal movement of traffic.
 4. When any vehicle is found upon a street, highway, alley, park, or other public grounds of the City in violation of any provisions of this chapter regulating the stopping, standing, or parking of vehicles.
 5. When any vehicle is parked upon a lawn, boulevard, or sidewalk.
 6. When any vehicle is found upon a street, highway, alley, park or other public grounds whose registered owner has failed to answer a traffic citation or letter informing him of a violation relating to restrictions on stopping, or standing, or parking of vehicles upon a street, highway, alley, park or other public grounds of the City involving said vehicle.
- B. Whenever an officer removes a vehicle from a street as authorized in this section and the officer knows or is able to ascertain from the registration records in the vehicle the name and address of the owner thereof, such officer shall immediately give or cause to be given notice in writing to such owner of the fact of such removal and the reasons therefor and of the place to which such vehicle has been removed. In the event any such vehicle is stored in a public garage, a copy of such notice shall be given to the proprietor of such garage.
- C. Whenever an officer removes a vehicle from a street under this section and does not know and is not able to ascertain the name of the owner, or for any other reason is unable to give the notice to the owner as hereinbefore provided, and in the event the vehicle is not returned to the owner within a period of three (3) days, then and in that event the officer shall immediately send or cause to be sent written report of such removal by mail to the State Department whose duty it is to register motor vehicles, and shall file a copy of such notice with the proprietor of any public garage in which the vehicle may be stored. Such notice shall include a complete description of the vehicle, the date, time and place from which removed, the reasons for such removal and name of the garage or place where the vehicle is stored.

D. Any vehicles removed pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be held until the costs and expenses of such removal and storage together with any and all fines or penalties imposed for the violations of this Chapter are paid.

SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

Snow removal will *not start* until *after* main snowfall or storm ends, unless an emergency arises.

Downtown and Emergency Routes are first priorities, followed by the hospital, schools and businesses. Residential areas will be done last, including home-based businesses.

DO NOT blow snow from driveways onto the streets.

Please pile snow in your yard. Adding to the snow already in the streets only slows the snow removal process or blocks the streets if they have been plowed.

**Please, if you know snow is coming do not park in alleys or on the street.
Please, locate extension cords away from curbs, do not leave in gutters.**

Garbage totes need to be left on the boulevard or in your driveway.

The garbage truck CAN reach them. If garbage totes are placed on the street they are in the way of snow removal equipment, the crews will not be out to 're-do' snow piles left around totes or parked cars once moved until all areas have been addressed.

We are trying to use the quickest and most efficient methods of snow removal with the least inconvenience. There will always be exceptions to these situations. We ask for your patience and cooperation.
